

Transfer Station Pilot Program Information

This is a pilot program in which 50 single family households in Pomfret may purchase a permit to dispose of household trash and recyclables at the Town of Woodstock Transfer Station.

For Safety: All loads MUST be covered and secured during transit to prevent litter & accidents.

Purchase Permits at the Woodstock Town Hall

Town Clerk Judy Walberg (860-928-0208 x320) issues permits during regular business hours. Annual sticker renewal begins on January 2. You must present vehicle registration at time of purchase. Checks are to be made payable to "Town of Woodstock."

Day Pass For Use of a Different Vehicle

» Residents who have purchased a yearly sticker, but need to temporarily use a different vehicle, must present vehicle registration (for the vehicle that will be used) to receive a one day pass at no cost. These can also be obtained at the Transfer Station with proper ID.

*Annual Permit Stickers MUST be affixed to driver's side front windshield or admittance will be denied.

Bulky Waste No opening of railings without attendant present.

Bulky waste disposal fees are based on weight — heavy loads will cost more for disposal. Bulky items may include, but are not limited to: a large assortment of household junk, "clean" (new, unpainted, unused) wood, empty or dried paint cans, large furniture, large toys, etc. Construction/demolition debris (sheet rock, shingles, and insulation) must not exceed 100 lbs. and must be in a separate container.

Loads must be assessed by the attendant prior to dumping, or additional fees may be charged. Payment must be made by check payable to "Town of Woodstock" (absolutely no cash or credit cards) at the time of disposal. A \$15 fee will be charged for checks returned by the bank as unpaid. Fee Schedule (Final fees will be determined by attendants after

reviewing loads.)

The disposal of **Demolition Material** (in excess of 100 lbs.) is restricted by the DEEP. You will need to make your own arrangements with a private hauler for removal.

Swap Shed—No items after 3pm on Sunday.

- Useable items ONLY as defined by attendants
- Vehicle loads are subject to same charges as bulky items and must see attendants before unloading.
- NO food items.
- NO broken or unstable items.
- NO computers or televisions
- NO stuffed chairs, couches or large furniture
- NO clothing.
- NO air conditioners, refrigerators or dehumidifiers.

Brush and Leaves—No dumping after 3pm.

- See attendant before offloading your leaves and clean brush under 3" diameter.
- No grass clippings.

Woodchips

- Available in limited quantities at no charge.
- Please see the attendant.
- Must be able to load yourself.

Refundable Bottles and Cans

Place in proper recycling area.

Paint Tuesday, Friday and Saturday morning

- · Products must be in original container with original label.
- Container must be sealed and in good condition with no leaks.
- Containers must be no larger than 5 gallons.
- No spray paints or aerosol cans. (paint care program only)
- Do not drop off any paint products without seeing an attendant.
- See attendant for list of acceptable products.

Mattresses and Box Springs—No charge to permit holders residing in Pomfret.

Transfer Station Regulations

All Transfer Station regulations are enforced by the attendants, and permit holders must adhere to their instructions.

- Proof of vehicle registration in the Town of Pomfret is required with a permit.
- Permit sticker is assigned to a specific vehicle, its owner/s, and a specific household. To use another vehicle, please see stipulations of the day pass (previous page).
- Day passes must be surrendered to attendant upon entry.
- Permits are NOT refundable.
- Place items in appropriate containers or areas as indicated
- Bulky loads MUST be assessed by attendant prior to dumping to be sure any additional assessment fees are accurate.
- * Violations of these regulations may result in loss of transfer station use, including permit revocation.
- * The Transfer Station is a one-way facility, please refrain from backing up for any reason!

CONTRACTORS / BUSINESS OWNERS may only dispose of their own personal household trash and bulky waste, NOT from their business.

Hazardous waste is NOT accepted at the Transfer Station. The Town participates in hazardous waste collection days—watch for local advertising. Please store the material safely until the collection day is held.
